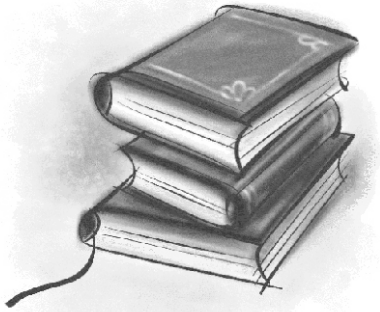

YOU SHOULD BE SAVED

God wants you to be saved, and that is His intention concerning you.

No matter where he went, a preacher preached, “You should be saved,” “You should be born again,” and “You should repent.” One day, a young guy who had noticed this approached him and inquired, “What is the reason you are preaching in this manner everywhere?” “Why don't you preach something else?”

The preacher said briefly, “It is because you should be saved.”

Today, many Christians argue against and grumble about servants of God who preach salvation and about those children of God who claim they are saved. They reason, “Why should they preach about salvation?” “Why should they claim to be saved?”

Dear reader, it is the burden of the Lord's soul that you repent and be saved. Because of this, He has emphasized salvation throughout the Scriptures. In the Old Testament, He calls on the people for repentance.

“Do I take any pleasure in the death of the wicked? declares the Sovereign LORD. Rather, am I not pleased when they turn from their ways and live?”

(Ezekiel 18:23) The preceding and succeeding verses both call us for salvation. **(Isaiah 55:7, Jeremiah 3:14, 22)**

According to the New Testament, God, who dwelt on earth in the name of Jesus, focused solely on salvation. **From that time on Jesus began to preach, “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near.” (Matthew 4:17)**

“The time has come,” he said. “The kingdom of God has come near. Repent and believe the good news!” (Mark 1:15)

Even the disciples dispatched by Jesus after His resurrection taught repentance. **“Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out.” (Acts 3:19)**

“now he commands all people everywhere to repent.” (Acts 17:30)

Even now, the Lord still employs His ministers to spread the same message. **'Salvation'** is not a new doctrine. The Lord has been implying this to His people since the beginning. Let go of futile arguments and **repent**. Your salvation is the Lord's primary concern because **He loves you**. The Lord urged me to write this book solely for this purpose.

Jesus Christ, died for your sake on the cross and rose again and is more concerned about your salvation than you are.

Nowadays, a lot of people fool themselves into believing that they are right in their own eyes even though they have never experienced salvation. Therefore, before learning what is salvation, we need to understand what is cannot be salvation.

Some people claim, “I don't get drunk, watch films, smoke, or fight like other people. I'm perfect.” People are misled since they mistake these experiences for salvation. My friends, such a righteous existence, is not salvation.

“I will ... cut off from you both the righteous and the wicked.” (Ezekiel 21:3)

“He destroys both the blameless and the wicked.” (Job 9:22) Thus, the Holy Bible describes the fate of the righteous ones. Therefore, even if you live a righteous life, you must be saved.

People who assert, “I cheerfully participate in the church and ministry activities” outnumber those who state, “I pray, read the Bible, attend the church, and give offerings regularly.” As a result, the former group claims to be better than the latter. These folks fool themselves. Such devotion cannot be considered

salvation. These are values a Christian should adhere to after receiving salvation.

Nicodemus, a teacher in Israel, who was also a Pharisee, went to Jesus once. He was a Pharisee who followed the Mosaic Law word for word. He was a Jew and fasted twice a week. In addition, he gave tithes from his earnings. He was well-versed in the law and taught it to the Jewish people.

Jesus told Nicodemus, **“no one can see the kingdom of God unless they are born again.” (John 3:3)** What exactly did He mean?

“Nicodemus, it's true that you've learned the laws and walk by them. You do really pray and regularly give tithes. You teach others. However, if you are not born again, if you have not repented and been saved, you cannot enter the kingdom of heaven.”

This is the message that Jesus Christ wants to convey to you as well, just as He did to Nicodemus. Your traditional life, offerings, and devotion will not lead you to the kingdom of heaven. **You should repent and be saved.**

Some boast, “Jesus Christ has performed many miracles for me since I prayed. Sickesses have been cured by my prayers. Jesus Christ has answered my prayers.” They do not, however,

experience salvation, therefore they remain in sin. Just because your prayer is heard, it doesn't mean you are saved.

Jesus Christ once answered even the devil's prayer. Jesus granted the Legion demons' request to cast them into the herd of pigs.

(Luke 8:26-33)

Therefore, don't fool yourselves simply because your prayer was answered.

You need to be saved!

***A Righteous and Devout
Life is not Salvation.***



In the Holy Bible, **salvation** is referred to by many terms, including '**repentance,**' '**regeneration,**' and '**forgiveness of sins.**' However, for our understanding, **we could define salvation as becoming a child of God.**

“The one who does what is sinful is of the devil.” (1 John 3:8) Whoever continues in sin is a child of the devil.

When someone who lives in sin repents and becomes a child of God, that is salvation.

Salvation is being redeemed from the dominion of the devil into the dominion of God – a child of the devil becoming a child of God. You must either be a child of the devil or a child of God. You cannot be both, just one.

For as long as you continue to lead a sinful life under the devil's dominion, you are a child of the devil. You are adopted into God's family when you turn from your sin, repent, and receive salvation.

“Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his (Jesus Christ) name, he gave the right to become children of God.” (John 1:12) God desires that you

become His child. Therefore, turn away from your sin and accept Jesus Christ as your personal Saviour.

I was raised in a Hindu family and practiced my faith in zeal. The Lord saved my life by His wondrous power in 1969 when I was fourteen years old and suffering from a terrible illness while being neglected by the doctors. Jesus Christ healed me miraculously.

I became a Christian after realising that Jesus Christ is the true God. I was a devout young man attending church regularly, reading the Bible, and praying as well. People would be surprised and say, “How devout is this Hindu boy?”

However, my heart or life was not transformed, neither had I the experience of salvation. Three years passed in this manner, yet no one taught me about salvation. I believed that the way I lived was the way a Christian would live.

In 1972, I attended a gospel crusade and heard the testimonies of many young people. In their testimonies, they claimed that Jesus had pardoned their sins, saved them, transformed their lives, and spoken to them. I was struck deeply by these testimonies.

I suddenly felt the need for salvation in my soul. I realised that my sins, too, should be

forgiven, and that I needed to talk to Jesus. After the meeting, I approached the servant of God who led the prayer. “Read this and pray,” he said, pointing to specific verses in the Bible. He said nothing else.

Once I reached home, I started reading these two verses and to pray. **“Surely the arm of the Lord is not too short to save, nor his ear too dull to hear. But your iniquities have separated you from your God;” (Isaiah 59:1,2)** These verses convicted me of my sins. When the Lord revealed my heart to me, I realised how far I had fallen into the dreadful pit of sin, despite the fact that I appeared good in the eyes of others.

When I realised that my sins had created a chasm between me and God, I started weeping and confessing my sins. As the Lord continued to convict me of my sins, I pleaded for His forgiveness. My heart's heaviness grew lighter as I confessed my sins.

Finally, the Lord said, **“I have taken away your sins that you may not die.” (II Samuel 12:13)** My joy was indescribable and immeasurable. True, there is no greater joy in the world than having our sins pardoned.

Despite the fact that I had been regularly attending church, praying, and reading the Bible for almost three years, I didn't truly become a Christian after the Biblical standard until I repented of my sins and accepted Jesus Christ. I became His child.

What a great joy! What happiness! My entire life was transformed. Not I, but Jesus, transformed my life. He will change you as well. Come to Jesus and confess your sins. Accept Christ Jesus. Your sins will be forgiven, and divine peace will overflow in your soul.

“Whoever conceals their sins does not prosper, but the one who confesses and renounces them finds mercy.”
(Proverbs 28:13)

WHAT SHOULD I DO TO BE SAVED?

When Paul and Silas, the Lord's ministers, were imprisoned in Philippi for the sake of the name of Jesus Christ, the jailor, who witnessed the power and miracles of God in them, asked them, **“Sirs, what must I do to be saved?”** **(Acts 16:30)**

Today, souls that witnessed the power and wonders of Jesus Christ are raising this question. Doesn't the same question emerge in your mind when you read of the love, forgiveness and power of Jesus Christ? I was praying over how to convey salvation in a way that everyone could grasp because so many people have these questions.

The Lord brought to mind **“The Prodigal Son”** narrative. This narrative is the best way to explain salvation. Let us read through the story told in **Luke chapter 15**. Jesus said, **“There was a man who had two sons.**

The younger one said to his father, 'Father, give me my share of the estate.' So he divided his property between them.

“Not long after that, the younger son got together all he had, set off for a distant country and there squandered his wealth in wild living.

After he had spent everything, there was a severe famine in that whole country, and he began to be in need.

So he went and hired himself out to a citizen of that country, who sent him to his fields to feed pigs.

He longed to fill his stomach with the pods that the pigs were eating, but no one gave him anything.

“When he came to his senses, he said, 'How many of my father's hired servants have food to spare, and here I am starving to death!

I will set out and go back to my father and say to him: Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you.

I am no longer worthy to be called your son; make me like one of your hired servants.'

So he got up and went to his father.

“But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion for him; he ran to his son, threw his arms around him and kissed him.

“The son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son.'

“But the father said to his servants, 'Quick! Bring the best robe and put it on him. Put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet.

Bring the fattened calf and kill it. Let's have a feast and celebrate.

For this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found.' So they began to celebrate.” (Luke 15:11-24)

(Only once you have understood this text in the Bible completely should you proceed to the next chapter. This portion provides all you need to know in order to be saved.)



What Should I Do To Be Saved?

REALIZE THAT YOU ARE A SINNER

The younger son, who had gone off track from his father, came to his senses only when he was hungry and was denied even the pods given to the pigs.

I had been to a village for a gospel crusade a few years ago. During the course of the day, the servant of God from that church accompanied me to a few houses.

We went to a house to pray for an elderly father who was ill. He struggled to get up and sit when he saw us. Before praying, the Lord prompted me to read Matthew 9:2 for him.

“Some men brought to him a paralyzed man, lying on a mat. When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the man, “Take heart, son; your sins are forgiven.”

After reading this passage, I asked, “Sir, has Jesus ever told you that your sins are forgiven?” “I’ve never sinned,” he retorted. “I regularly attend church. I pray and take care of my own affairs. I don’t drink or inebriate like others, nor do I harm others.”

The moment he said this, the Lord reminded me to read him another passage from the Bible. I started reading right away.

“For it is from within, out of a person's heart, that evil thoughts come—sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, lewdness, envy, slander, arrogance and folly.

All these evils come from inside and defile a person.” (Mark 7:21-23)

As I read, I noticed a change in his expression. “Sir, have you not committed any of these sins?” I inquired. “Yes, I have committed the sins stated in these verses,” he said in a quiet voice.

This ultimately proved to be the first step towards his salvation.

Dear reader, you must first admit that you are a sinner in need of salvation before you can receive this magnificent salvation. Are you satisfied because you don't drink or behave badly? Are you content with your regular church attendance and prayer? Read God's word carefully.

“The acts of the flesh are obvious: sexual immorality, impurity and debauchery;

idolatry and witchcraft; hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, dissensions, factions and envy; drunkenness, orgies, and the like. I warn you, as I did before, that those who live like this will not inherit the kingdom of God.”
(Galatians 5:19-21)

“Nor should there be obscenity, foolish talk or coarse joking, which are out of place, but rather thanksgiving.

For of this you can be sure: No immoral, impure or greedy person—such a person is an idolater—has any inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and of God.”
(Ephesians 5:4,5)

“Or do you not know that wrongdoers will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived: Neither the sexually immoral nor idolaters nor adulterers nor men who have sex with men nor thieves nor the greedy nor drunkards nor slanderers nor swindlers will inherit the kingdom of God.” (I Corinthians 6:9,10)

Are you still in sin according to these scriptural verses? Are not you guilty of the sins

listed in this passage? Accept that you are a sinner in God's eyes. Recognise your need for salvation.

Are you not troubled by the absence of happiness and peace as well as by sicknesses, anxieties, and oppressions? Recognise that your worries are caused by your sins. The younger son, who should have been content and happy in his father's house, was now starving to death since he parted ways with his father and was unable to eat even the pods provided to the pigs. He realised it was because he had left his father's house.

You should understand that you are going through a lot of hardships, being unwell, and not having any peace in your life because you have turned away from God and living in sin after your own desires.



COME TO JESUS

Many people who are aware that they are sinners are nonetheless unsaved because they have not repented of their sins.

When the prodigal son who had fled from his father acknowledged his sins, he returned to his father. **“So he got up and went to his father.” (Luke 15:20)** Admit that you are a sinner. You have been convicted of your sins. However, don't stop there. Come to Jesus. He is your Creator and Father. He gave his life for you and still loves you. You can approach Him with confidence.

He will not reject you if you come to Him after confessing your sins and repenting for them. Jesus Christ has promised, **“... whoever comes to me I will never cast out.” (John 6:37)**

You may come as well. He will accept you. He won't turn you down. Come to Jesus Christ determined to reject anything in your life that is a sin against the Lord. The Lord says, **“Have I any pleasure in the death of the wicked, declares the Lord GOD, and not rather that he should turn from his way and live?” (Ezekiel 18:23)**

You ought to repent of your ways. So far, you have walked according to your desires. You did whatever pleased you. You did everything your mind and flesh desired. Return to Jesus with the determination, “I will walk in a manner pleasing to the Lord Jesus Christ and will do whatever pleases Him.”

“... Repent! Turn away from all your offenses; then sin will not be your downfall.” (Ezekiel 18:30) Repent of all your misdeeds. Turn from your transgressions of the Lord's commands and teachings. Salvation is an experience in which your path to hell is diverted to heaven. In contrast to the earlier, you are now heading towards Jesus Christ. Quit pleasing Satan and opt to please Jesus Christ.

A young man once shared his burden with me.

“I enjoyed whatever my eyes lusted after. I walked as my mind directed. However, there was no peace in my soul. Will Jesus Christ forgive me for my awful sin against the Lord? Will God pardon my sins?”

You may wonder, “Will Jesus accept a traitor like me? Will he pardon my sins?” Jesus will certainly accept you and pardon your sins. He will not cast away anyone who repents of their sins and comes to Him.

When the Prodigal Son realized his sins and returned to his father, his father spotted him even though he was a long distance away.

“while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion for him; he ran to his son, threw his arms around him and kissed him.” (Luke 15:20)

For every single step you take towards Jesus Christ, he will move seven steps towards you. However, you should take the first step. Take the first step towards Jesus right now.

Repent and live. (Ezekiel 18:32)



CONFESS YOUR SINS

When the Prodigal Son was convicted of his sins and returned to his father with a broken heart, he told him, **“Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son.”** (Luke 15:21)

Whatever sins you are convicted of, confess them to Jesus. I have seen people praying “Lord, I am a sinner. Forgive my sins.” I've observed a lot of people who after praying thus, fall away after a few days because they have many hidden sins in their hearts.

This prayer serves as an illustration of how a repentant sinner should confess his sins. However, every sin that the Holy Spirit convicts you of must be confessed.

Jesus is at the door of your heart, knocking. He cannot enter just because you say, “Jesus! Come in!” You must rise up, unlatch the door, and open it. Only then can He enter in.

Every sin you've done acts as a lock on your heart's door, keeping Jesus from entering. You should confess your sins one by one and

remove each lock. Only when the last lock is unlocked can Jesus Christ enter.

Locks labelled 'Pride,' 'Anger,' 'Envy,' 'Chastisement,' 'Love of Money,' and many more locks are hanging at your door. These locks can be removed only by confession of sins. Confess to Jesus Christ any sin that the Holy Spirit convicts you of without hesitation.

If the Holy Spirit convicts you that you need to return something you had unjustly taken from someone else, do so right away. Get reconciled with those who have caused you bitterness, enmity, and conflicts because you quarrelled with them.

Walk in line with the Scriptures, **“Make every effort to live in peace with everyone.” (Hebrews 12:14)** and **“... love your enemies.” (Matthew 5:44)**

When you confess your sins in this way, gracious God, will forgive you and accept you as His child.

***The one who confesses (his sins)
and renounces them finds
mercy. (Proverbs 28:13)***

RECEIVE YOUR SALVATION IN FAITH

When the Prodigal Son repented and acknowledged his misdeeds, his father received him as if he had done nothing wrong. This is the love of a Father. Jesus Christ, our Heavenly father, is also like this. He graciously forgives our sins when we confess them.

When the repentant son came home, his father dressed him in new clothes, gave him a ring, and put new shoes on his feet. Without hesitation, the son received them. Dear Friend, you, too, should **accept forgiveness of sins in faith**. Jesus Christ carried your sins on the cross that He might forgive you. **(I Peter 2:24)**

Jesus Christ was wounded and bruised for your sins and transgressions. He offered His holy blood on the cross to grant you forgiveness and peace. **(Isaiah 53:5, Colossians 1:20) Above all, Jesus Christ became sin for you on the cross.**

Jesus Christ committed no sin. He was Holy and knew no sin, yet He was made sin for you. Yes, Jesus became a drunkard to forgive a drunkard, a fornicator to forgive a fornicator, a wicked person to forgive a wicked one, and a

sinner to forgive your sins. He sacrificed His precious, spotless, and holy blood to cleanse and purify you from your sins.

Thus, Jesus Christ suffered on the cross, earning salvation and pardon for you. “... **the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin.**” (I John 1:7) This forgiveness and sanctification of sins should be received by faith. **“For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith.”** (Ephesians 2:8)

Many people seek a vision or a sign as confirmation of their salvation when they repent. God offers such things in the lives of select people. However, God's plan requires us to accept salvation **by faith.**

“... He was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities;” (Isaiah 53:5) When we believe this verse and confess our sins to Jesus Christ, realising that we are sinners, we should also believe that the Lord is merciful to us, as stated in the verse, **“Whoever conceals their sins does not prosper, but the one who confesses and renounces them finds mercy.”** (Proverbs 28:13)

We must believe that the blood of Jesus Christ is powerful enough to cleanse us

thoroughly of our sins, as mentioned in the verse, **“... the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin.” (I John 1:7)** We ought to have faith that He has forgiven all our sins, as written in the Bible, **“If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.” (I John 1:9)**

“As far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us.” (Psalm 103:12) We should believe this scripture because it says that the Lord completely put away our sins. We should wholeheartedly believe and praise God, claiming, “Now I am a child of God,” since the word of God says, **“Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God.” (John 1:12)**

We can see true peace and joy sweep over our souls when we believe and praise God likewise. The joy that the Holy Spirit bestows on us becomes an obvious evidence that we have been saved. **“The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God's children.” (Romans 8:16)**

Thus, the joy, peace, and assurance that the Holy Spirit imparts in our souls convinces us that **we are saved.**

***The divine peace the Holy Spirit
bestows within our
souls is a confirmation of salvation.***



CONFESS BY YOUR MOUTH

“For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved.” (Romans 10:10)

Only when we openly share our salvation with others does it become perfect. Many saved people backslide because they are negligent in sharing this priceless, glorious salvation with others. We must confess our salvation.

Some people ask, “Is it not sufficient if we keep our salvation within ourselves? Why do we have to notify everyone?” But the Holy Bible says, **“it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved.” (Romans 10:10)** Testify to others about the salvation and peace you have experienced, as well as the transformation Jesus Christ has brought about in your life.

When you proclaim it with your mouth, Jesus Christ, your Saviour, is glorified through you, and your adversary, the devil, is put to shame.

***Your testimony
puts the devil to shame!***

WHY SHOULD WE NOT ABSTAIN FROM RECEIVING?

Dear Friend, The Holy Spirit has penned this message for your salvation. **Why don't you accept the salvation that Jesus Christ has gained for you on the cross? Today is the day of salvation!**

Now is the time for God's favour. Don't put it off till another day. Your life's tomorrow is not in your hands. Hence today is the day of your salvation. Today is the day you should acquire true peace and forgiveness of sins. Your transformation as God's children should occur today and right now.

Kneel only at the feet of Christ Jesus. Confess your sins to Jesus Christ, who endured the cross in your place. Acknowledge that you are a sinner. Confess the sins that the Holy Spirit convicts you of. Pray in tears and a broken heart until you are freed from the burden of sin. Praise God in faith that Jesus Christ has forgiven your sins.

Inherit salvation... Your sins are forgiven... You are a child of God...

What a great joy!

Yes, I am a child of God!

Why Should We Not Abstain From Receiving?

IF YOU REJECT SALVATION...

“How shall we escape if we ignore so great a salvation?” (Hebrews 2:3)

Jesus Christ has purchased this salvation for you by shedding His blood and dying on the cross. **If you reject this precious salvation, you are doomed to chastisement.** You cannot enter God's Kingdom (**John 3:3**), but you will be a part of the lake of fire and brimstone.

(Revelations 20:15, 21:8)

What is your situation, friend? Are you willing to repent and get peace in this life, as well as in the kingdom of God in eternity, or are you going to remain in sin, without peace in this world and chose the Lake of Fire in eternity?

Decide for yourself! Decide today and right now!

WHEN YOU ARE SAVED...

Many things happen when we are saved.

◆ **Peace in our soul**

Divine peace surges in our soul, which had lost its peacefulness due to the burden of sin. Our soul rolls over with courage, faith, hope, and joy rather than fear, confusion, and sorrow. It gains the assurance, “I will be in the Kingdom of God, with God after my death.”

◆ **Great joy in heaven**

“... there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents.” (Luke 15:7)

Heaven is watching over our salvation and rejoices when a sinner is saved. The Father, who saved us by sending His One and Only Son to this earth, is also happy. Jesus Christ, who died on the cross for our sins and rose again, rejoices, as does the Holy Spirit, who will lead us to the end.

The saints in heaven rejoice greatly. There is great joy before the angels as well.

(Luke 15:10)

When the Prodigal Son returned to his father after repentance, the father forgave and accepted him saying, **“Let's have a feast and**

celebrate. For this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found.' So they began to celebrate.” (Luke 15:23,24)

◆ **Sorrow in hell**

Hell weeps when a sinner is saved because one of its inmates, previously in the possession of Satan, will no longer be tormented by the devil, since it has come under the custody of Jesus Christ. This makes the devil unhappy when we are saved.

When a sinner repents, his soul rejoices greatly. Heaven rejoices as well, while hell laments.



Guard your salvation

We must be cautious in guarding the salvation that God has gifted us with. **“... the one who stands firm to the end will be saved.” (Matthew 24:13)** We must comprehend certain aspects of salvation in order to preserve our salvation.

1. I am saved

This is the first experience of Christian life. When we repent of our sins and accept Jesus Christ into our hearts, we receive salvation or the forgiveness of sins. We are given the audacity to proclaim, “Jesus Christ has saved me.”

2. I am being saved

Not everything in our Christian life ends on the same day when we accept Jesus Christ and are saved. It's just the beginning. The first step in Christian life is to say, “I am saved.”

Since we have experienced salvation, it doesn't mean that we won't sin anymore. We are redeemed from the power of sin in salvation, but we still remain in the presence of sin. We cannot flee away from the presence of sin as long as we are in this world. Therefore, we have to struggle against sin always.

Sin envelops us. Sinful temptations encircle us at home, school, college, work, and everywhere else. Saved children of God won't sin deliberately. But we experience failures every day. We are so hurt for when even the smallest flaw.

Our soul will cry out in agony, "Oh, I have sinned." We need to seek the Lord's pardon for that sin right away in our prayers. Since Jesus Christ is interceding for our sake to the Father, He immediately pardons that sin and offers us complete peace of mind once again.

"... if anybody does sin, we have an advocate with the Father—Jesus Christ, the Righteous One." (I John 2:1)

"If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." (I John 1:9)

We need to lay down our lives in the Lord's presence every day, evaluate ourselves, and allow Him purify us. When we do so, we will continue to grow in holiness.

We have to progress to a stage where we can declare, "I am saved daily!"

3. I will be saved

Jesus Christ will return to this earth and gather all of His saved ones with Him. We won't

sin anymore since, on that day, we'll be caught up from this world and be with the Lord. It is on this day that we are completely saved. This was why Jesus Christ said, “... **the one who stands firm to the end will be saved.**” (Matthew 24:13)

Let us preserve our salvation as we eagerly await the return of our Lord Jesus Christ!

“Godly sorrow brings repentance that leads to salvation and leaves no regret, but worldly sorrow brings death.” (II Corinthians 7:10)
